My name is Anastasiadou Athina and I have acquired my BSc in Psychology from Ioannina University, as well as my MSc in Psychology, with specialization in Neuropsychology from the University of Maastricht. While studying for my master's degree I performed a research project concerning the human memory and the way it is influenced by the number of words someone is asked to recall. My thesis was based on two pharmacological models (Biperiden and Acute Tryptophan Depletion) which, upon administration to healthy subjects, cause cognitive deficits, most of them focused on memory systems, and we examined whether they can be considered as models for Alzheimer's Disease and Mild Cognitive Impairment, through primacy – recency effect. During my bachelor I completed my traineeship at "Greek Association of Alzheimer's Disease and Associated Disorders" and worked with adults with memory impairment through therapeutic interventions. I have also worked in the past with children with behavioral disorders and learning disabilities. Currently I am working as a volunteer at the "Greek Association of Alzheimer's Disease and Associated Disorders" as a psychologist.
