Maria Aivazoglou is a dedicated psychologist specializing in neurodegenerative diseases, with expertise in neuropsychological assessments and non-pharmacological interventions. She is completing her Master's degree in Neuroscience and Neurodegenerative Diseases from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and has received her Bachelor's degree in Psychology from the same institution (2020). Her professional experience includes roles as a psychologist at the Alzheimer Hellas, where she worked at the "Saint John" Day Center, focusing on enhancing the quality of life for individuals with dementia and their families. Additionally, she completed an internship at the "Elpida" Center for Autistic Individuals, gaining further insight into specialized care. She has also volunteered in mental health and refugee support programs, such as SolidarityNow's "STARTnow" initiative. Finally, Maria Aivazoglou is actively involved in research projects supporting dementia care, including the Erasmus+ project titled "Dementia does not affect my heart," which explores intergenerational exchange as a therapeutic approach and the WCACD project, which explored "Web Content Accessibility for people with Dementia and Mild Cognitive Impairment," promoting digital inclusivity and accessibility for individuals facing cognitive challenges.
