

## **Fyndanis Valantis**

Valantis Fyndanis holds a PhD in Psycholinguistics/Neurolinguistics from Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. He is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Rehabilitation Sciences at the Cyprus University of Technology and a Researcher at the Center for Multilingualism in Society across the Lifespan (MultiLing) at the University of Oslo. Prior to his current appointments, he held a tenure-track Associate Professor position in the Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders at Long Island University-Brooklyn, a Postdoctoral Research Fellow position at MultiLing, University of Oslo, a Marie Curie (Postdoctoral) Fellow position in the Department of Linguistics at the University of Potsdam, as well as research and teaching positions in Greece and Italy. Moreover, he is a Fellow of the Young Academy of Europe and an Academy of Aphasia Fellow. His areas of expertise are adult language disorders and bilingualism/multilingualism. Specifically, he conducts research on: (1) morphosyntactic deficits in stroke-induced aphasia and dementia of the Alzheimer type; (2) the relationship between morphosyntactic production and cognitive capacities such as short-term/working memory and speed of processing; and (3) the relationship between bilingualism/multilingualism and cognitive abilities. Currently, he is the Principal Investigator of the FRIPRO project "Machine Learning Aphasia".
